

# Supply Chain Recovery

Supply Chain Recovery is going to be on the top of the corporate agenda in the coming months. During this webinar we intend to offer everyone interested an opportunity to reflect on how to best approach supply chain recovery and prepare for the future.

We will describe a scenario and provide some insights of what might work and not work in the coming months. We will also stress potential differences across industries and geographies. The magnitude of the impact on supply chain and economic of the current disruption is still unknown but we can still pay attention to a few early warning signals. Being both prepared and conscious of the uncertainties will be an asset in the month to come. With the interconnectedness of the global economy and the ongoing attention given to risks, many companies have developed and now start implementing their business continuity plans. This is a very systematic approach that will be deployed along supply chains, but it needs the right mindset.

In the webinar we will complement the logic of business continuity plans with two perspectives. We will stress the importance of relationships in hard times and suggest what type of mindsets and relations can help make a difference.

We will describe what data could be collected not just for today's recovery but also for taking tomorrow's decision.
